



COVID-19 & Peru Travel

Entry requirements: Detailed information

1. To enter Peru, regardless of the country of origin, passengers must accredit a **COMPLETE VACCINATION SCHEME** against COVID-19, **completed at least fourteen (14) days** before boarding at their point of origin. **Unvaccinated passengers** can present a **negative molecular test** taken **no more than 48 hours before boarding** the flight. Children under twelve years of age only need to be asymptomatic to board.

NOT VACCINATED PASSENGERS MUST PRESENT A NEGATIVE PCR TEST (MAX. 72 HOURS BEFORE TRAVELING).

Children under 12 years old only need to be asymptomatic to board.



TRANSPORTATION IN PERUVIAN TERRITORY

- All Peruvians and foreigners 18 years of age and older traveling inside the country on interprovincial buses (for example, the Lima – Paracas, and Cusco – Puno routes) or 12 years of age and older traveling commercial flights must prove their two doses of vaccination. This is also required to board the train and bus to Machu Picchu.
- Passengers over 40 years old, must show they are fully vaccinated and with a booster (that is, three doses), in case they are eligible to receive it according to current protocol.
- **If they don't have the complete vaccination scheme, they need to take a molecular test (PCR) and have a negative result no more than 48 hours before the trip.**

ENTRANCE TO CLOSED SPACES*

In the same way, to enter closed spaces (restaurants, stores, supermarkets, museums, cultural centers, among others), all Peruvians and foreigners 18 years old and over must prove that they have both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Passengers over 40 years old, who are eligible to receive a booster according to the current protocol, must present their vaccination certificate with the three doses. In this case, this is not substitutable by any tests.

Please take this into account before your trip.

Visas and immigration control

- Argentinian, Paraguayan, Ecuadorian, Uruguayan, Brazilian, Bolivian, Venezuelan and Chilean citizens: admission by presenting their national identity card.
- Other countries in the Americas and most of Europe: passport in force.

Upon entry, the immigration authorities will determine the maximum number of days you will be able to stay in the country. They usually grant 90 days for tourists. If you exceed the days of stay listed on your passport, you will have to pay a penalty on your departure.

Entry Requirements

Fully vaccinated passengers

Perú is open to all vaccinated passengers and they are **exempt** from presenting a negative COVID-19 test result and **may be** exempt from quarantine.

Only nationals and residents of Perú with travel history to South Africa and Botswana will be required to quarantine. More detailed information can be found in the *Quarantine* section below.

Passengers must complete the **Affidavit of Health and Geolocation Authorization** to enter the country. More detailed information can be found in the *Forms* section below.

COVID-19 Test **Required**

All passengers, vaccinated and non-vaccinated, are required to present a COVID-19 test taken at most 1 day before departure from the first embarkation point.

There are several options for eligible passengers traveling to the United States from countries other than US Territory. i.e., American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands:

Test taken at most 1 day before departure from the first embarkation point.

- Test type accepted: Antigen, NAAT, RT-LAMP, RT-PCR or TMA.
- Time window: At most 1 day before departure from the first embarkation point.
- Applicable age: Travelers aged 2 years or older.
- Languages accepted: Not specified. English, Spanish or Portuguese are recommended.
