

OVID-19 & Chile Travel

Entry requirements: Detailed information

According to the Protected Borders Plan, Chile is currently in Level 1 Alert Phase, which does not include travel restrictions. However, there are some measures to be considered.

1) Fill in the online Travel Affidavit 48 hours before boarding, providing contact information and health and travel records. This form will display a QR code as a means of verification. It is available at www.c19.cl.

2) Diagnostic tests will be carried out randomly at the entry point to Chile. Confirmed cases will be isolated in the declared address in the C19 form or a Sanitary Residence.

Visitors with symptoms at their arrival must be isolated.



Transportation In Chilean Territory

- All Chileans and foreigners older than 18 traveling inside the country on interprovincial buses (for example, Iquique – Santiago de Chile) or than 12 years taking commercial flights must have their mobility pass.

- If you don't have the mobility pass, you must present a negative PCR test result taken in Chile no more than 72 hours before traveling.

- Wear a mask during the trip.

Entrance To Closed Spaces*

To enter closed spaces (restaurants, stores, supermarkets, museums, or cultural centers), Chileans and foreigners older than 18 must issue their mobility pass. Please, have this in mind during your trip.

Visas & immigration control

Citizens from Argentina, Brazil, Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Uruguay, Paraguay, and Peru are admitted by presenting their national ID.

Citizens from Venezuela, Haiti, Dominican Republic, or Cuba entering as tourists must issue a transitory stay visa prior arriving in Chile.

Citizens from other countries in America and most of Europe are admitted only with their passports.

Upon entry, the immigration authorities will determine the maximum time you can stay in the country. They usually grant 90 days for tourists, and you have to pay a fine if you exceed them.

Quick facts 🔮

- The passport must have six months of validity before entering Chile.
- The passport needs to have one page for the entry stamp.
- Tourist Visa is free and issued at the port of entry.
- You must declare money if you carry more than US\$10,000.
